

We are pleased to present the new fabric selection from our collection. Following a curatorial process carried out by Viccarbe's design team, we have included the best fabric offerings on the market to provide new possibilities for projects—promoting recycled textiles, expanding the color range, strengthening all price groups, and of course, maintaining the collections that have become hallmarks of our brand.

This curatorial work was guided by the pursuit of sustainability, material richness, quality, durability, and ease of maintenance, as well as curiosity and a touch of boldness to introduce innovative textures and more vibrant colors. It marks a step forward in a catalogue that, while consistent, refreshes the possibilities for both products and spaces.

Through this document, you can explore this new and extensive range of fabrics—first with a general overview, followed by individual details. We invite you to learn more about each collection and discover the full color palette in the professionals section of our website: viccarbe.com.

At Viccarbe, we continue to move forward on our path toward increasingly sustainable practices, and this philosophy has played a central role in the selection of our new fabrics. Throughout the review and analysis process of each collection, their environmental impact was carefully considered.

According to this criterion, priority was given to fabrics made from 100% post-consumer recycled materials or those with a high percentage of recycled content, as well as to textiles incorporating natural fibers sourced from sustainable production.

SUSTAINABLE CRITERIA





Fabrics such as Guest and TelaMia (by Kvadrat), or Parcel Loop and Renewed Loop (by Gabriel)—all made from 100% post-consumer recycled material—are now part of the collection, offering an ideal option for projects with high environmental requirements, without compromising on quality, durability, or color variety.

Meanwhile, fabrics such as Technicolor and Saxion by Kvadrat, Synergy and Penta by Camira, and Credo by Rohi are also included among these sustainable options, as they are composed of between 90% and 100% natural fibers, such as virgin wool or English combed wool (in the case of Technicolor). This significantly reduces the impact and consumption of materials derived from non-renewable sources.

Continuing this environmental review, Granit, Natura, and Sorra (by Crevin) contain up to 90% recycled fibers in their composition. Kvadrat goes even further with Re-wool 2, combining 45% virgin wool with 45% recycled wool, created from post-industrial fiber remnants collected from its own wool textile production.

These gestures promote circularity, just as we at Viccarbe encourage upcycling by collecting fabric waste from our own products to give it a second life through collaboration projects with NGOs or recycling plants, where the material is shredded and reprocessed to create new and useful fabrics.




Balance is where harmony is found. With this expanded fabric catalogue, we aim to continue promoting the collections that are essential to our brand in terms of design, while also introducing textiles that bring a refreshing new perspective to our offering.

The new additions to the catalogue open up exciting possibilities for countless interior styles. They awaken the sense of touch through textures ranging from curly bouclé to velvety chenille, and stimulate the eye with iridescent effects, patterns that suggest a 3D volume through thread interplay, or fabrics that evoke natural surfaces such as granite.


Above all, natural colour takes centre stage. Vibrant, primary, warm, bold... A wide spectrum of shades in each new collection invites unlimited creativity.




This range of fabrics represents a key proposal for the brand, as it is based on textile-to-textile recycling, meticulously crafted from a blend of recycled textile waste and post-consumer recycled polyester. Recycled and recyclable — a circular system for a sustainable, versatile, and multifunctional fabric. Its color palette focuses on natural tones ranging from earthy reds to stone greys, with greens and blues in between, adding up to more than 45 options.

This fabric is made from recycled polyester, featuring a mottled finish created by a structure that combines a dope-dyed yarn with a soft white chenille yarn. Guest combines comfort with high performance and offers a timeless color range.

It also represents, together with TelaMia, the first Kvadrat reference within Viccarbe's G1 category.


Louise Sigvardt, co-founder of the renowned studio Bunn, created the color palette for Guest to further emphasize its velvety touch, offering a versatile and balanced range centered on natural tones accented with saturated pastels such as rust red, butter yellow, and sky blue.

The TelaMia collection by Kvadrat is designed by Giulio Ridolfo, an expert in the use of color as a tool to build narratives through an approach rooted in observation, materiality, and imagination.

TelaMia is woven in a plain weave structure using a white yarn in the weft and a black-and-white dope-dyed melange yarn in the warp. It is then piece-dyed to create a warm, high-performance, and recyclable fabric.

With up to 18 colorways, Ridolfo's vision goes beyond a simple chromatic proposal — it represents a deep exploration of design and production, aimed at integrating color into the fabric through the very structure of the yarn.



Crevin conceived Granit as a fabric designed to stand the test of time, offering functionality and beauty that grow richer with the years.

The collection draws inspiration from stone sediments, achieving not only a color palette that evokes nature but also organic volumes by combining four different recycled materials.

This balance of low-impact materials, minimally processed and free from chemical additives, makes Granit a responsible, durable, and elegantly timeless design solution.

Parcel Loop is a fabric by Gabriel, developed in collaboration with designers Cenk Kivrikoglu and Luisa Allegri.

It is a versatile collection featuring a mottled texture, multidirectional structure, soft touch, and subtle nuances under the light. Its color proposal is not only about intensity but about creating depth and dimension, adding a level of sophistication to its applications. Thanks to its durability, it is an ideal choice for hospitality and workplace environments.



Natura by Crevin is inspired by the simple, imperfect beauty of nature.


Starting from a printed chenille, Natura offers a linen-like effect combined with a specially developed yarn that recalls the softness of silk. With 60% recycled content, it achieves a serene result with an irregular texture and an almost organic character, evoking a sense of connection to the earth and craftsmanship.

Its blend of natural tones with seasonal colors, together with its slightly curly surface, makes this fabric the perfect choice for contemporary interiors.

60% RECYCLED CONTENT







A monomaterial fabric made entirely from new English worsted wool, it reduces transport emissions while supporting the local wool industry. With its subtly mottled appearance and soft touch, its open weave structure makes it especially suitable for upholstering organic forms. The fabric is also sustainable in its dyeing process, using 30% of the raw material in its natural, undyed state. The result is a textile of great softness, high durability, and a wide-ranging color palette. For Technicolour, Saville draws inspiration from the five vivid tones of the spray used to mark livestock, combining them with five neutrals to create a palette of up to 30 colorways. These tones are achieved by dyeing the wool tops and blending them in precise proportions before



Sorra-Fr by Crevin evokes nature and the texture of sand grains — a return to traditional craftsmanship.

As a mono-composite polyester fabric, it is 100% recyclable, allowing for a second life cycle. In addition, this collection belongs to Crevin's Performance+ family, ensuring easy maintenance and high durability. Its touch comes alive through a dense, honest texture: imperfectly perfect.


Its name comes from the five rich wool yarns, meticulously crafted and selected, that are combined to create iridescent effects and multitone nuances. Inspired by fine worsted wool tailoring, it offers exceptional drape and touch thanks to its sophisticated yarn.

Available in up to 33 colors, the collection spans a wide chromatic range, from vibrant tones to more natural and subdued options.

Re-wool 2 is a Kvadrat creation by Danish designer Margrethe Odgaard, who specializes in color and textiles from a sensorial and emotional perspective.

From an environmental standpoint, Re-wool 2 stands out for being woven with warp yarns spun from post-industrial wool fibers collected from Kvadrat's own production at the Wooltex mill, ensuring material quality while reducing waste to nearly zero.


From a design perspective focused on color, Odgaard revisits the original Shades of Light collection —composed of hand-painted samples inspired by the transitions between light and darkness in Scandinavian landscapes— updating it with a more saturated warp. The result is a palette that is more vibrant, deeper, and almost three-dimensional in appearance.

Synergy is Camira's proposal for a collection that stands as a symbol of natural simplicity.


Composed of 95% virgin wool, it is a rich fabric that combines remarkable softness with outstanding performance. To the touch, it offers a gentle felted texture; to the eye, a chromatic richness expressed through up to 75 shades.

The result of a refined blend of fiber-dyed and piece-dyed tones, Synergy becomes a versatile option capable of adapting to every project.

Nobel is a design by Gabriel made entirely from premium recyclable wool.

This collection combines timeless design with the inherent durability of wool, resulting in a rich, voluminous texture where thick and thin yarns intertwine to create a soft and enveloping effect.

Behind its simple appearance lies a resilient fabric that supports a color palette of up to 30 shades — 24 solid tones and six melange options — elegantly transitioning from cool to warm hues.

Credo is presented by Rohi as its universal classic.

With an elegant structure, the textiles are composed of three different tones created through a subtle interplay of matte and lustrous yarns. The result is a harmonious and balanced fabric of exceptional quality, thanks to its main raw material: wool — naturally flame-retardant and renewable.

With more than 20 available colors, Credo offers a wide range of possibilities for application across diverse projects.


Rohi's Sera collection is a crepe-style fabric designed to reflect the tactile qualities of nature.

Its grainy touch, organic appearance, and the combination of two or three colors in each version make this fabric a natural expression, composed of up to 94% virgin wool.

Greens and browns evoke mountain landscapes, pinks and oranges suggest sunrises, while varying shades of grey recall stony terrains. The Sera color palette conveys natural sophistication through its sensory weave.

Moss, by Kvadrat, is designed by architect and designer Vincent Van Duysen, who took inspiration from his own home. Anna Vilhelmine Ebbesen collaborated with him on the development of this collection as part of Sahco.

In keeping with Van Duysen's signature style, the fabric draws on essential forms and tradition, reinterpreted through a contemporary perspective. A twisted yarn combined with chenille gives the textile's surface a textured structure with a sense of movement and a soft touch.

The purity of his designs is also reflected in a palette of up to 22 colors featuring monochrome and two-tone combinations, ranging from cool cement and soft blue to olive green, curry yellow, and natural wood shades.

The acclaimed Belgian designer Raf Simons signs the Saxion collection for Kvadrat.

A modern, refined bouclé with a natural and soft finish, Saxion perfectly embodies how Simons combines the sensitivity of fashion with the rigor and durability of an upholstery fabric — composed of nearly 90% combed wool. Drawing on his extensive experience leading major fashion houses, Simons brings his distinctive vision to Kvadrat in this stylishly timeless collection.


Inspired by the colors of traditional Japanese textiles, he presents a palette of up to 17 shades, featuring hues such as ultramarine, rhodochrosite pink, and sunflower yellow, alongside a range of elegant neutrals including greys, dusty tones, and porcelain whites.
